You may pick one or more of these young people to write about and you may want to mention other kids in the story as well such as Walter Cunningham, Little Chuck Little, Burris Ewell, Cecil Jacobs and Francis Hancock. So please criticize "To Kill a Mockingbird" Thesis! Take one or more of the forms of discrimination in To Kill a Mockingbird and write an analytic essay in which you explain the forms and, if applicable, compare and contrast the types of discrimination. Be sure to consider not only the final worldview at which each arrives, but to look at the novel as a whole and identify how their belief systems develop. So please tell me how this sounds, any improvements im open to anything! Questions that you might want to consider include: If justice and fairness are so elusive, how can Atticus and Scout continue to believe in them? Remember to begin each developmental paragraph with A.
